Baxter Estates Shoreline Improvement Project

The Nassau County Department of Public Works has begun the shoreline stabilization project north of Robert Dayton Park in the Village of Port Washington North. This work is being coordinated with the Village of Baxter Estates' Shoreline Stabilization Project, made possible through a \$7.7 million New York State grant awarded by Governor Kathy Hochul to help protect our vulnerable shoreline from coastal erosion and flooding.

This grant-funded project is a critical investment in the future of our waterfront. The disappearing shoreline at Baxter Beach has contributed to habitat loss, erosion, and frequent flooding along Shore Road, which can significantly disrupt travel and emergency access, during severe weather events. These improvements will help stabilize the shoreline, reduce flooding, enhance natural habitats, and create a raised pedestrian walkway connecting Baxter Estates to the Baywalk, making the area safer and more accessible for all.

The Nassau County sea wall stabilization project is progressing and as a result the right lane of shore road heading south approaching Mill Pond is still closed, so expect delays.

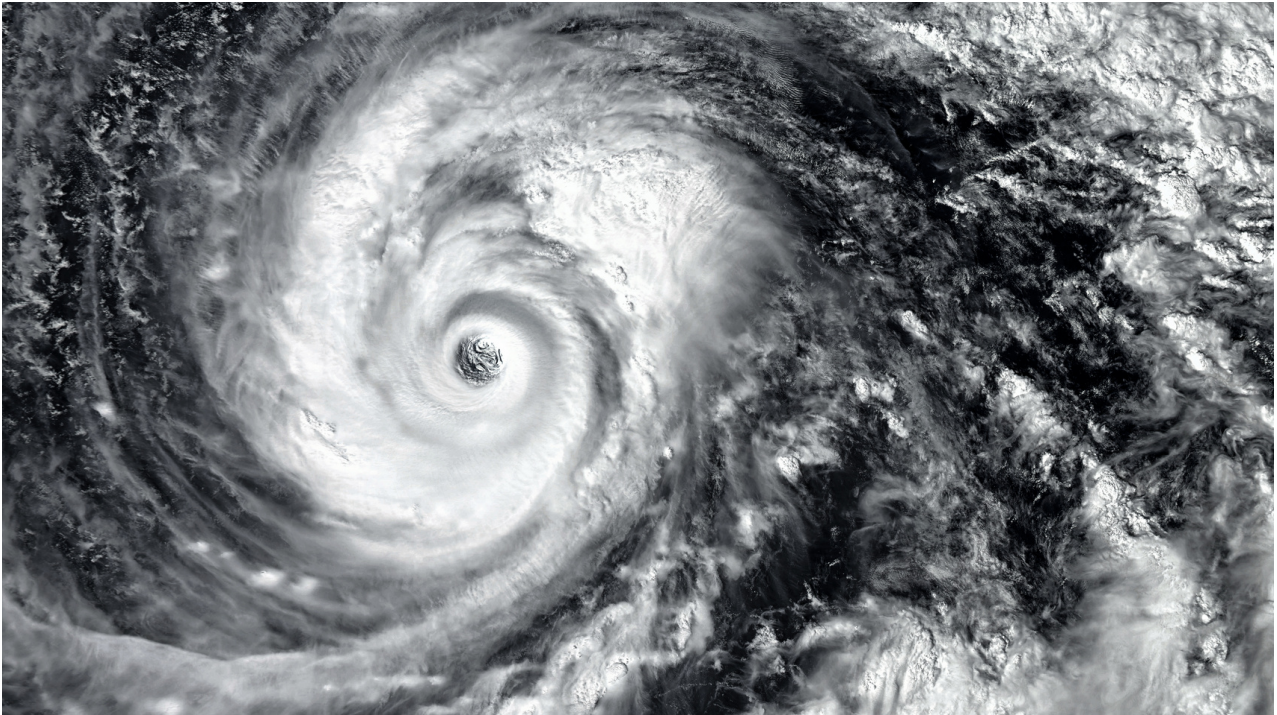
